

## 2024 Drug Policy Research 101: Student Training Program

#### OVERVIEW OF THE ODPRN

The Ontario Drug Policy Research Network (ODPRN), established in 2008, aims to foster an innovative drug policy research program supported by a network of scientific thought leaders from across Ontario with the capacity to generate scientifically sound research for the purpose of informing drug policy decisions.

#### OVERVIEW OF THE STUDENT TRAINING PROGRAM

The ODPRN Student Training Program aims to engage with students to develop capacity in drug policy research in Ontario. Trainees involved in this one-year collaborative program will work towards obtaining a drug policy training research certificate through the ODPRN. Through this program, trainees will have access to online training aimed at providing information around drug policy, patient-oriented research, and methodological concepts.

This program will also act as a networking opportunity for prospective drug policy trainees who will have a chance to liaise with scientific academic researchers and ministry representatives. There is no cost to participate in this program.

The main objectives of the program are:

1. To provide trainees with knowledge in drug policy research, pharmacoepidemiologic methods, patient-oriented research, and knowledge translation strategies.
2. To establish a multidisciplinary environment that allows students to collaborate and network with individuals, including other trainees, academic researchers, clinicians, patients, and policy-makers.
3. To provide trainees with an understanding of real life policy decision-making processes.

#### PROGRAM COMPONENTS

Trainees involved in this program must successfully complete the following 3 pillars:

1. **Learning:** View and complete all online drug training modules by June 30, 2024.
2. **Skill-building:** Attend at least 5 of the 6 bi-monthly webinars (hosted during business hours, Monday – Friday from 9:00am – 5:00pm).
3. **Networking:** Attend and participate in the Fall 2024 In-Person ODPRN Student Training Program Networking Event (location: Toronto) where students will have the opportunity to liaise with a multidisciplinary audience and discuss their own research. Students will also have 1-1 mentorship opportunities with members of the ODPRN Stakeholder Advisory Panel (SAP) to further their network across various disciplines (optional).

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. Must be enrolled in an Ontario post-graduate program (medicine, pharmacy, MSc, PhD, etc.) with a strong, demonstrable interest in drug policy research. Preference will be given to students who are currently involved in drug policy research and/or who describe specific plans for conducting drug policy-related research in the future.
2. Student engagement will be assessed throughout the course of the year. Students who do not participate in the minimum number of activities for each of the program components listed above will not receive a certificate of completion.
3. Students must be available to attend 5 of the 6 webinar during business hours, Monday – Friday from 9:00am – 5:00pm and make all efforts to attend the Fall 2024 In-Person ODPRN Student Training Program Networking Event.

5. August	Engaging with Individuals with Lived/Living Experience
6. October	Drug Policy and its Impact on Health and Healthcare

1. In-Person Annual Fall ODPRN Networking Event <b>(mandatory)</b>	<p>Opportunity for students to come together and network with other students, ODPRN SAP members and industry professionals. Please note, that dependent on the social distancing measures, this event may be held virtually. The event includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A panel speaking to “how we got here” as an opportunity for students to hear and ask questions around different career paths.</li> <li>• Round table discussions with experts in the field focusing on different topics of interest to the students (e.g. tips for successful grant applications, careers in private vs. public sectors, how to make your research relevant to policymakers, effective engagement with the public, etc.).</li> <li>• If the event is held in-person, 5-minute student thesis presentations will be scheduled providing students will have the opportunity to present their research and receive high-level feedback from a panel of SAP</li> </ul>
